# Transfer Out Students Annual Report – 2009

## Introduction

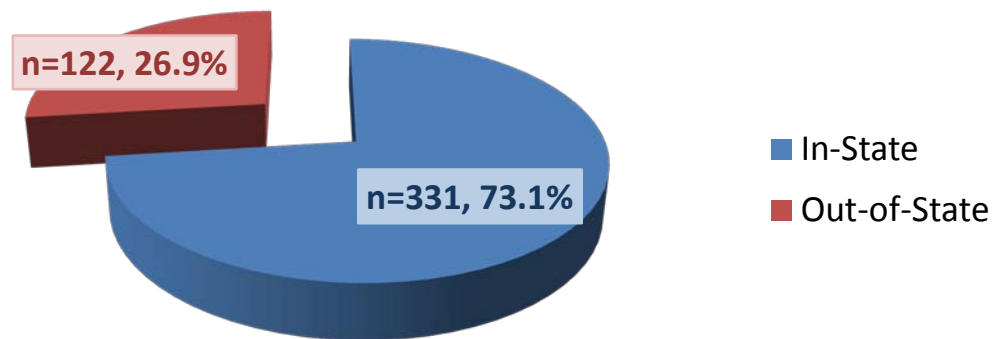
An annual report is prepared for the System of Connecticut Community Colleges pertaining to students' patterns of transfer. This report represents the two cohorts who last attended Housatonic Community College in fall 2006 and spring of 2007 and transferred to another institution of higher education by the fall 2008 and spring 2009 respectively.

To clarify, this reflects **two distinct cohorts** each with a two-year window of opportunity. The data was obtained in Banner using the SWRXF58 extract.

## Fall 2006 and Spring 2007 Cohort

The fall 2006 and spring 2007 cohort consisted of four-hundred-fifty-three (453) students who transferred to other educational institutions. The majority (n=331, 73.1%) of students who transferred chose institutions within the state of Connecticut after being enrolled at Housatonic Community College.

Transfer (Out) Students

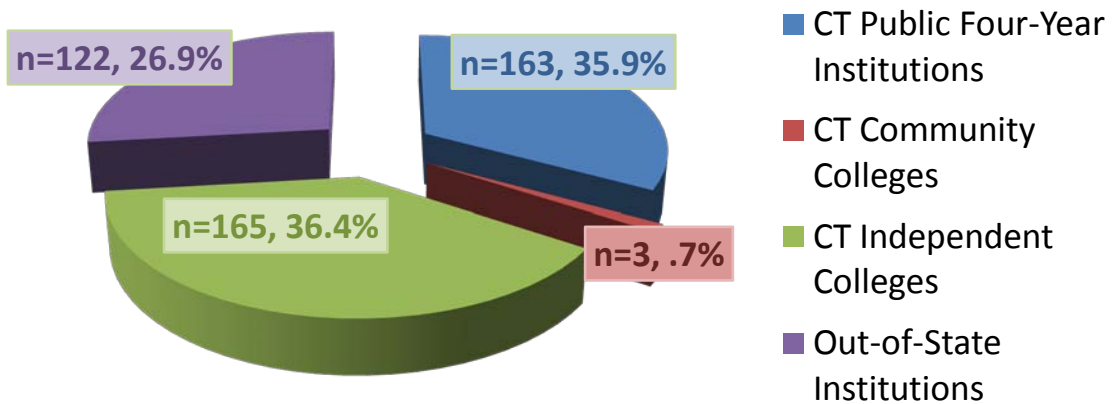


Four-hundred-fifty (450) of the transferring students were residents of Connecticut while three (3) students were recorded as out-of-state residents.

## Fall 2006 and Spring 2007 Cohort - Transfer to Institutions

Of the four-hundred-fifty-three (n=453) fall 2006 and spring 2007 cohort who transferred to other educational institutions, one-hundred-sixty-three (n=163, 36%) of these students transferred to Connecticut state public four-year institutions, three (n=3, 0.7%) student transferred to another community college within the state, one-hundred-sixty-five (n=165, 36.4%) students enrolled in Independent colleges within the State of Connecticut, and one-hundred-twenty-two (n=122, 26.9%) students enrolled in out-of-state colleges.

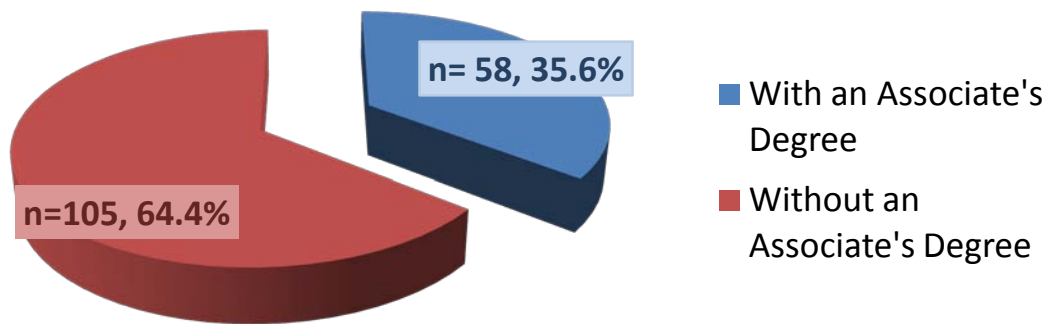
### Fall 2006 & Spring 2007 Cohort Transfer Out Students



## Fall 2006 and Spring 2007 Cohort - Associate Degree Status of Students Who Transferred to CT Public Institutions

Of the one-hundred-sixty-three (163) Housatonic Community College students who transferred to four-year institutions within the State, fifty-eight students (n=58, 35.6%) earned an associate's degree before they transferred to four-year institutions in the state of Connecticut.

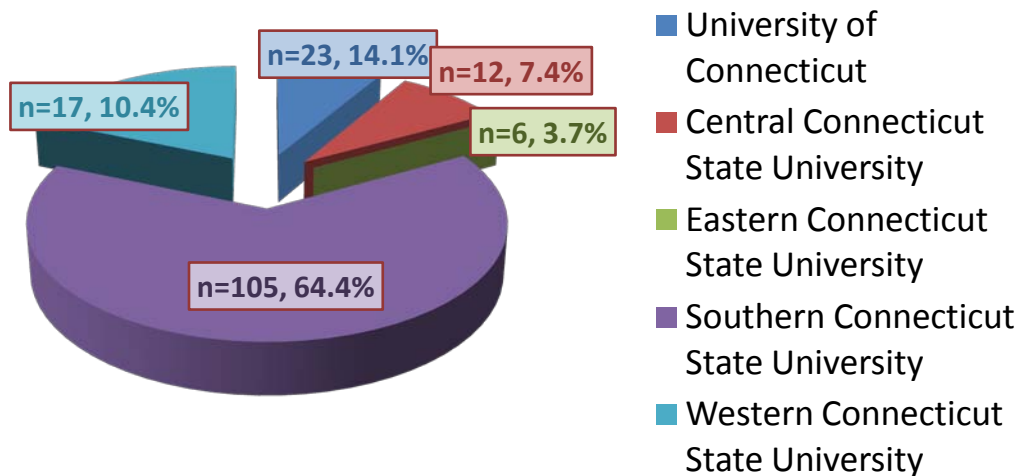
### Fall 2006 & Spring 2007 Cohort of Students Who Transferred to Connecticut Four-Year Public Institution



## Fall 2006 and Spring 2007 Cohort - Most Selected Public Four Year Institutions in Connecticut

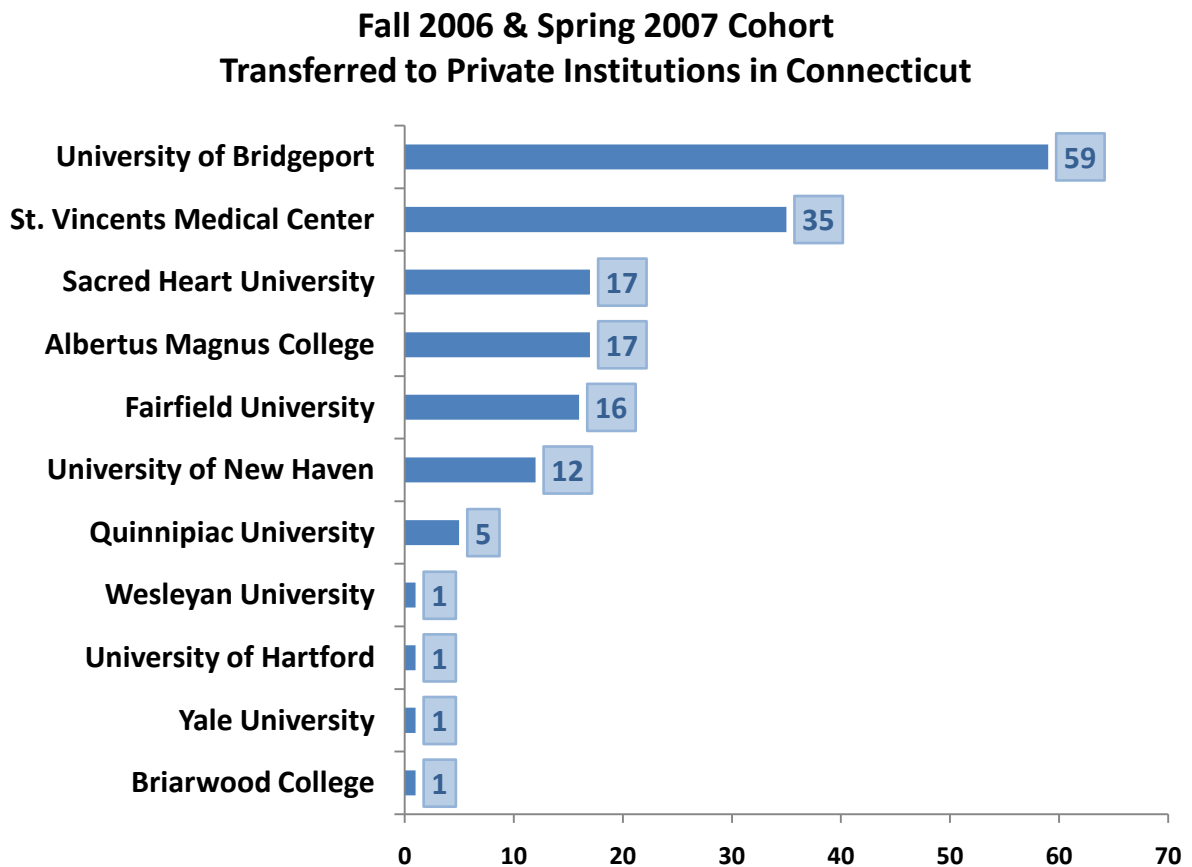
Of the one-hundred-sixty-three (163) students who chose to transfer to public four-year institutions within the state of Connecticut one-hundred-five (n=105, 64.4%) chose to enroll in Southern Connecticut University.

### Fall 2006 & Spring 2007 Cohort Transferred to CT State Universities



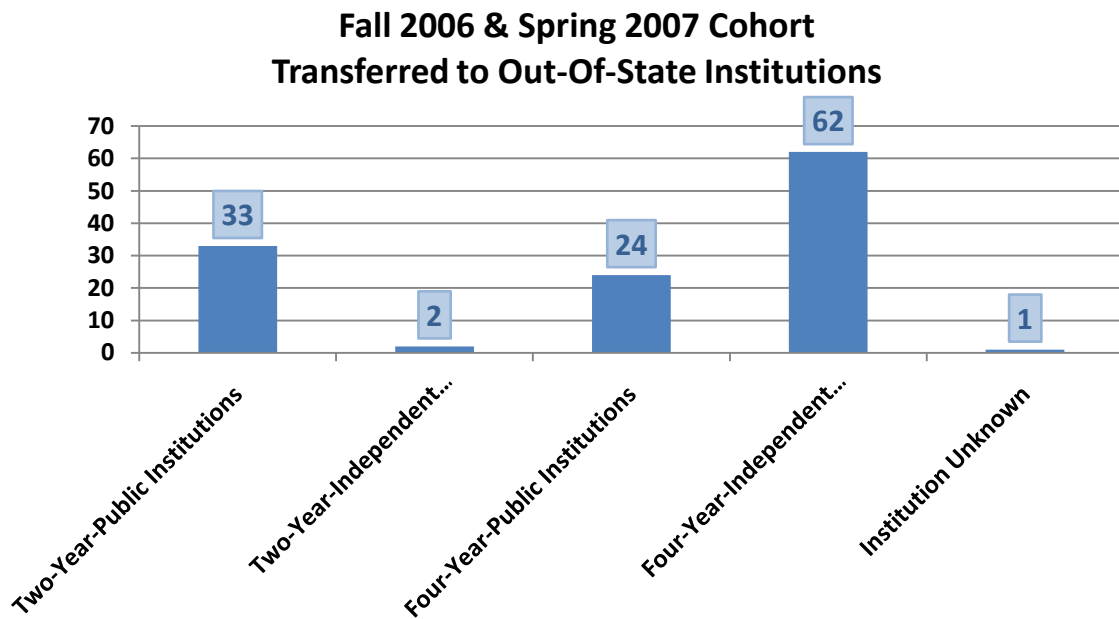
## Fall 2006 and Spring 2007 Cohort - Most Selected Independent Institutions in the State of Connecticut

Of the one-hundred-sixty-five (165) transfer students who chose to enroll in private universities, the majority enrolled at the University of Bridgeport (n=59), St. Vincent's Medical Center – School of Nursing (n=35), Sacred Heart University (n=17), Albertus Magnus College (17), and Fairfield University (n=16).



## Fall 2006 and Spring 2007 Cohort - Transferred to Out-of-State Institutions

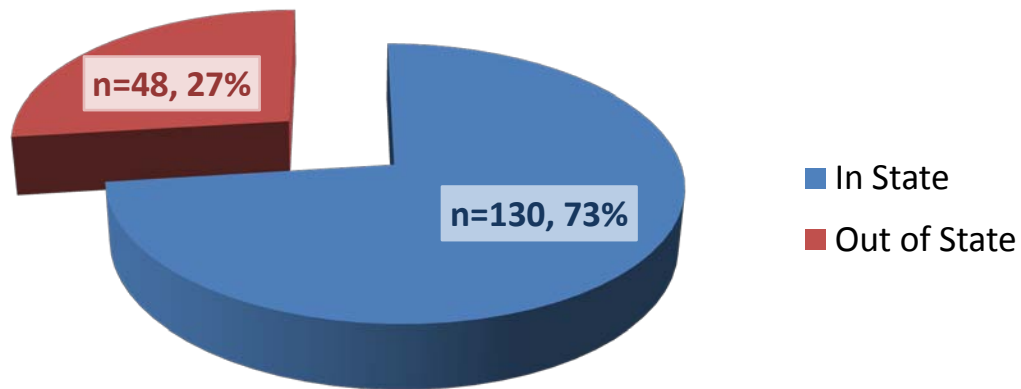
Of the one-hundred-twenty-two students who chose to transfer and enroll in colleges out-of-state, the majority of students (n=62) chose four-year-independent institutions.



## Fall 2006 Cohort Transfer Students

The fall 2006 cohort consisted of one-hundred-seventy-eight (178) students who transferred to other educational institutions. The majority (n=130, 73.0%) of students who transferred chose institutions within the state of Connecticut.

### Fall 2006 Cohort of Transfer (Out) Students

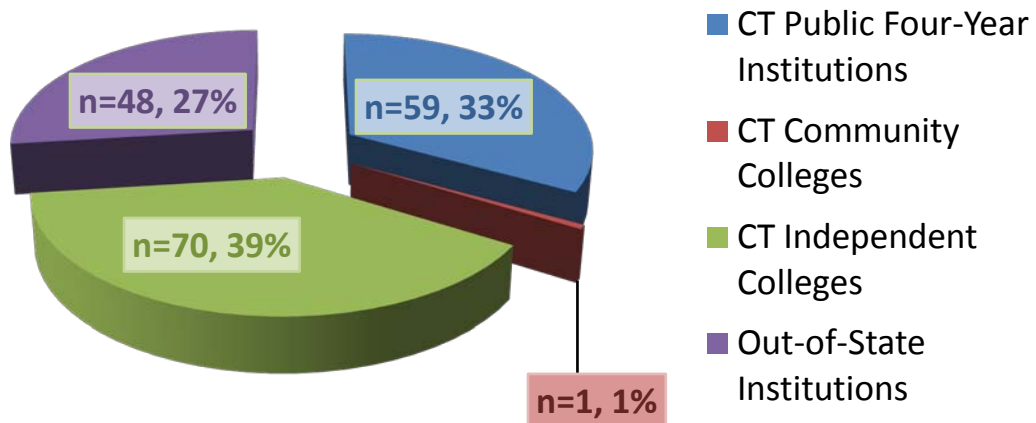


One-hundred-seventy-six (176) of the transferring students were residents of Connecticut while two (2) students were out-of-state residents.

## Fall 2006 Cohort - Transfer to Institutions

Of the one-hundred-seventy-eight (n=178) fall 2006 cohort who transferred to other educational institutions, fifty-nine (n=59, 33%) of students transferred to public four year institutions, one (n=1, 1%) student transferred to another community college within the State, seventy (n=70, 39%) students enrolled in independent colleges within the state of Connecticut, and forty-eight (n=48, 27%) students enrolled in out-of-state colleges.

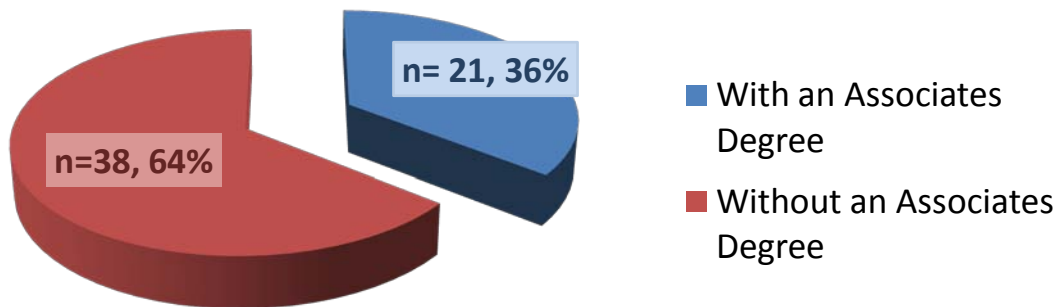
### Fall 2006 Cohort Transfer Students



## Fall 2006 Cohort - Associate Degree Status of Students Who Transferred to CT Public Institutions

Of the fifty-nine (59) Housatonic Community College students who transferred to four-year institutions within the State, twenty-one students (n=21, 36%) earned an associate's degree before they transferred to the four-year institution in the state of Connecticut.

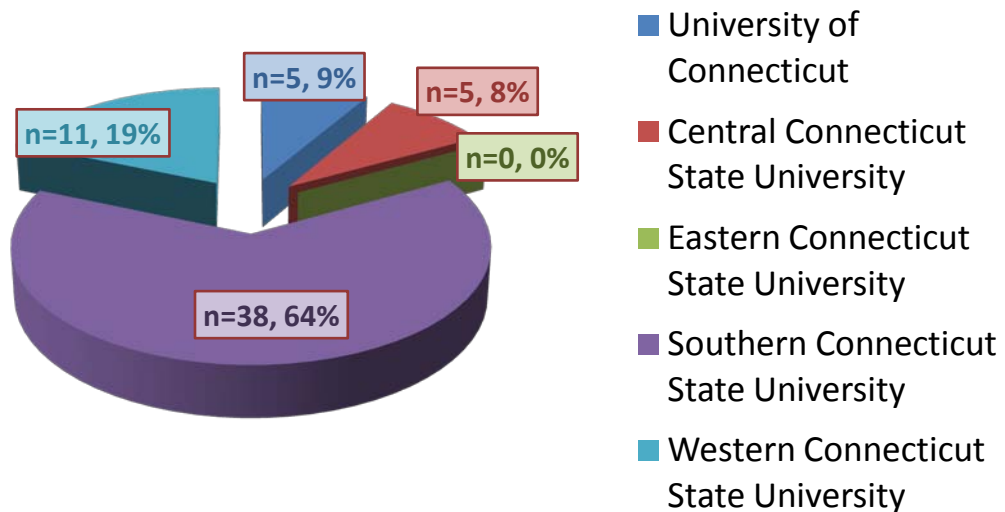
Fall 2006 Cohort of Students

## Fall 2006 Cohort - Most Selected Public Four-Year Institutions in Connecticut

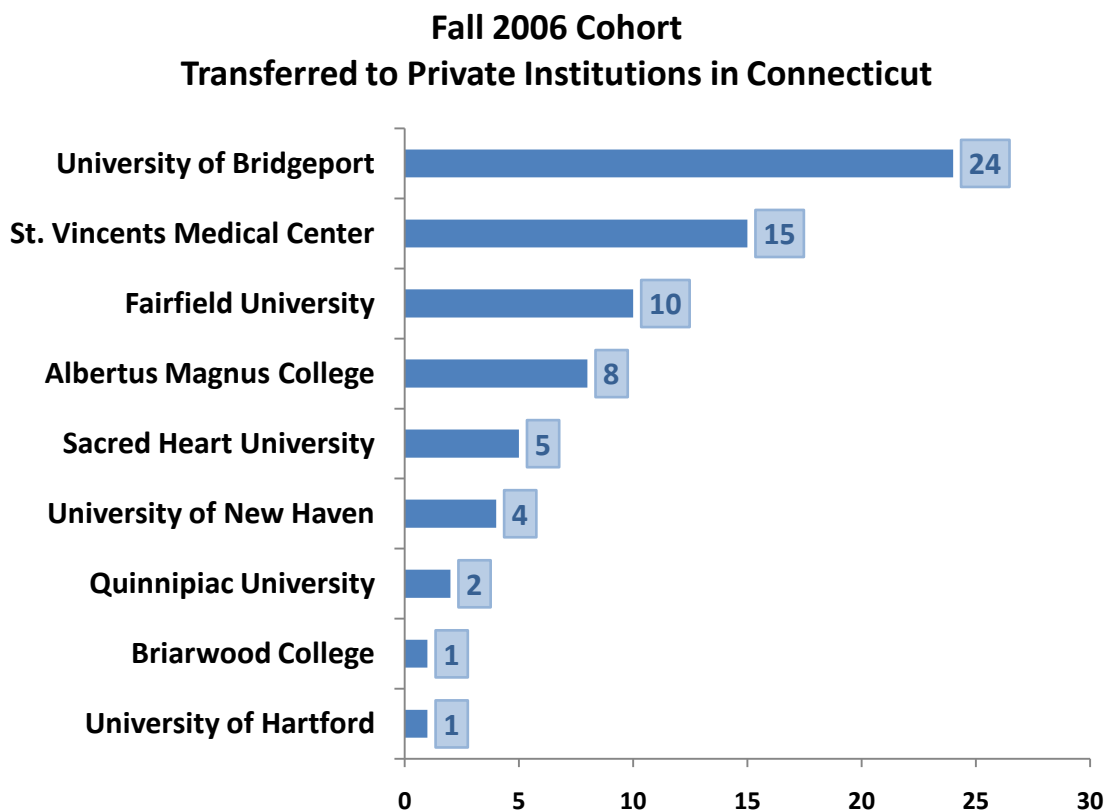
Of the fifty-nine students who transferred to public four-year institutions within the state of Connecticut thirty-eight (n=38, 64.4%) chose to enroll in Southern Connecticut University.

Transferred to CT State Universities



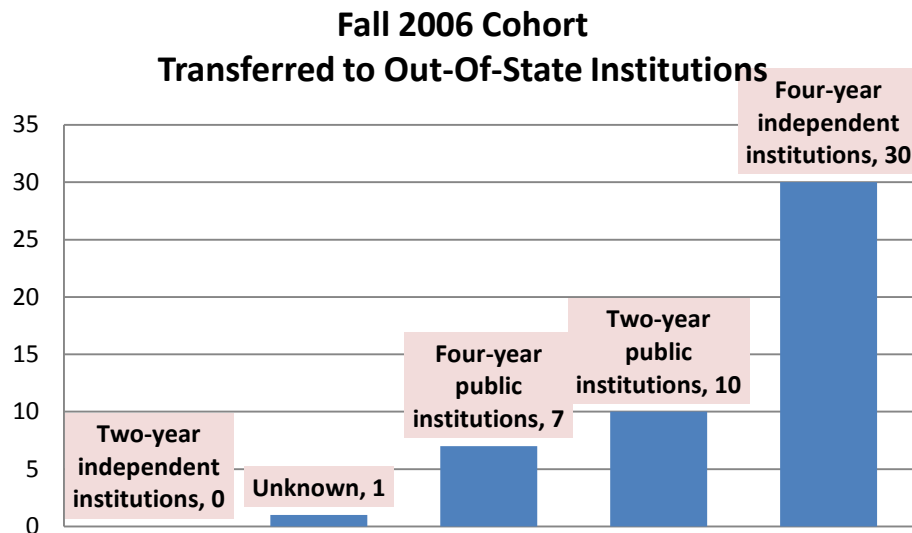
## Fall 2006 Cohort - Most Selected Independent Institutions in Connecticut

Of the seventy (70) Fall 2006 cohort transfer students who chose to enroll in private universities, the majority enrolled at the University of Bridgeport (n=24), St. Vincent's Medical College – School of Nursing (n=15), and Fairfield University (n=10).



## Fall 2006 Cohort - Transferred to Out-of-State Institutions

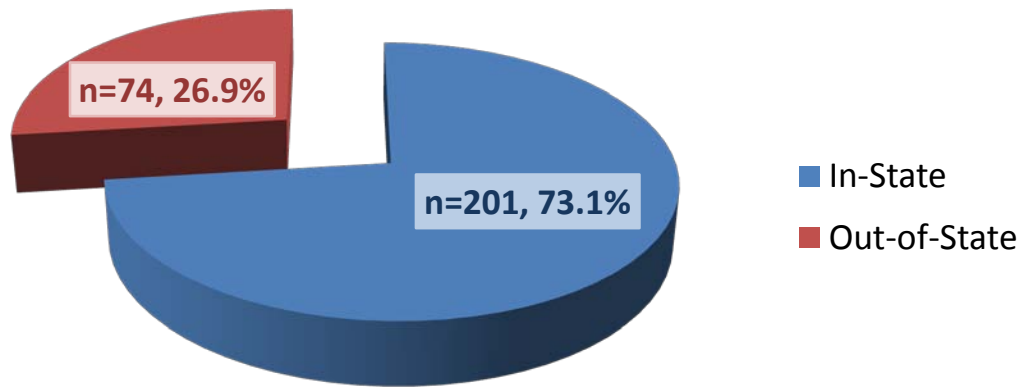
Of the forty-eight students who enrolled in colleges out-of-state, the majority of students (n=30) chose four-year-independent institutions.



## Spring 2007 Cohort

The spring 2007 cohort consisted of two-hundred-seventy-five (275) students who transferred to other educational institutions. The majority (n=201, 73.1%) of students who transferred chose institutions within the state of Connecticut.

### Spring 2007 Cohort of Transfer (Out) Students

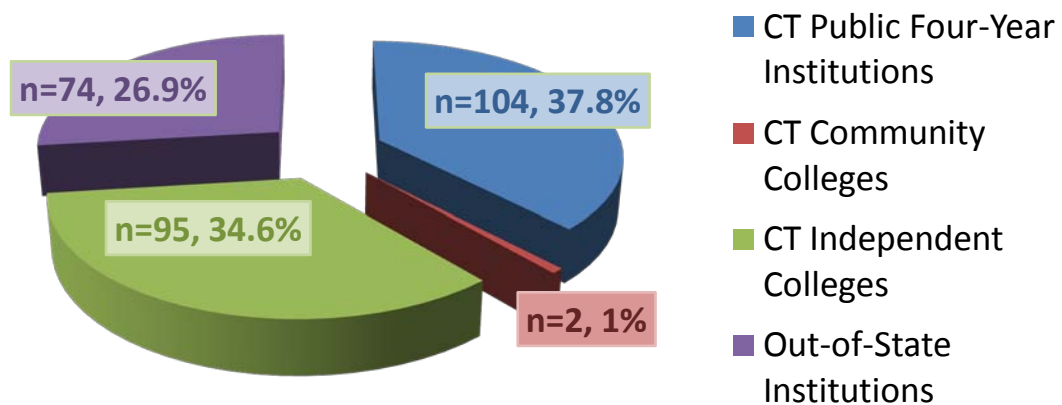


Two-hundred-seventy-four (274) transferring students in the spring 2007 cohort were residents of Connecticut.

## Spring 2007 Cohort - Transfer to Institutions

Of the two-hundred-seventy-five (n=275) spring 2007 cohort who transferred to other educational institutions, one-hundred-four (n=104, 37.8%) of students transferred to public four-year institutions, two (n=2, 1%) student transferred to another community college within the state, ninety-five (n=95, 34.6%) students enrolled in independent colleges within the state of Connecticut, and seventy-four (n=74, 26.9%) students enrolled in out-of-state colleges.

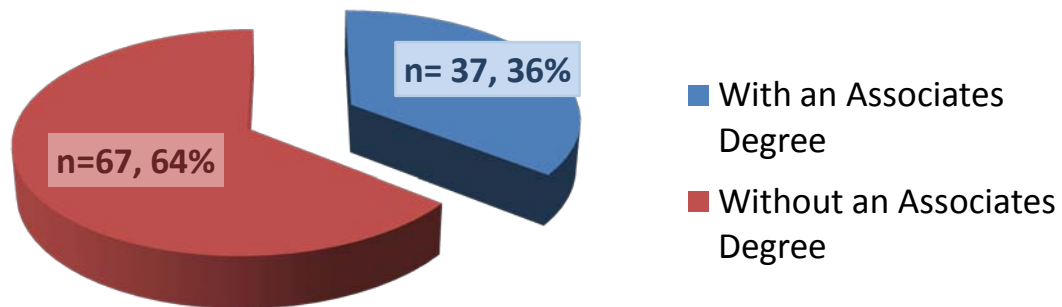
Spring 2007 Cohort

## Spring 2007 Cohort - Associate Degree Status of Students Who Transferred to CT Public Institutions

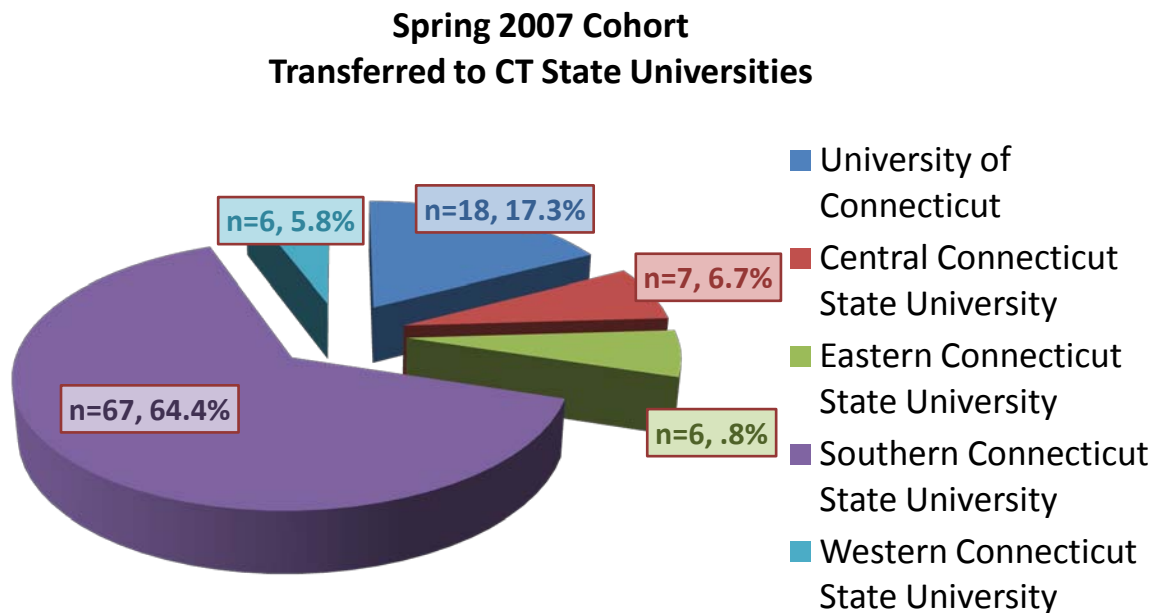
Of the one-hundred-four (104) Housatonic Community College students who transferred to four-year institutions within the state, twenty-one students (n=37, 35.6%) earned an associate's degree before they transferred to their four-year institution in the state of Connecticut.

Transferred to Connecticut Four-Year Public Institution



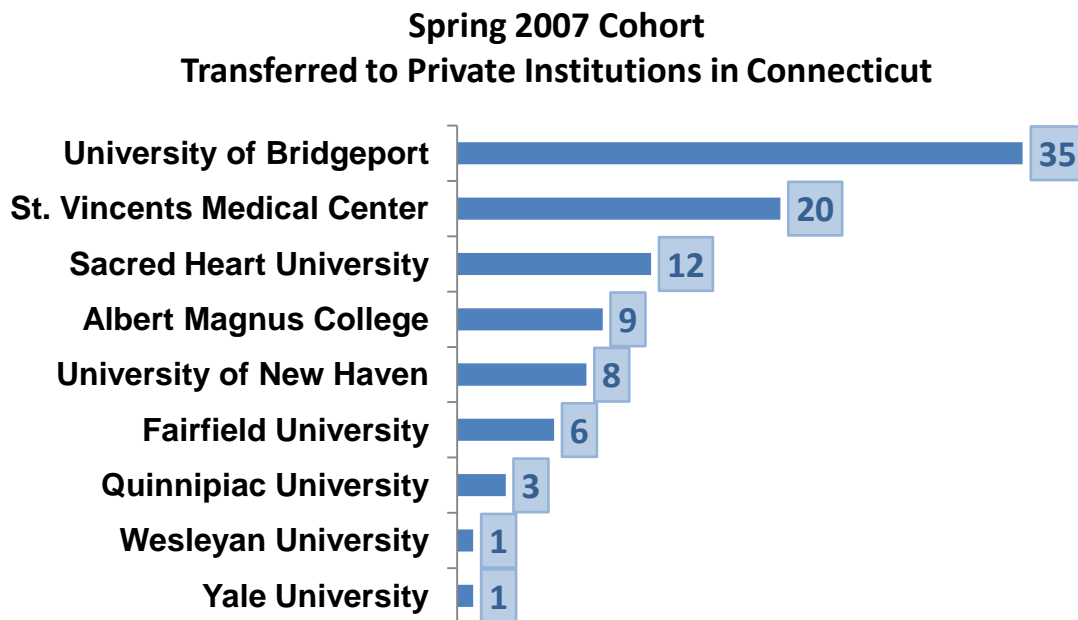
## Spring 2007 Cohort - Most Selected Public Four-Year Institutions

Of the one-hundred-four (104) students who transferred to public four-year institutions in the spring 2007 cohort, sixty-four percent (n=67, 64.4%) chose to enroll in Southern Connecticut University.



## Spring 2007 Cohort - Most Selected Independent Institutions in the State of Connecticut

Of the ninety-five (95) transfer students who chose to enroll in private universities, the majority enrolled at the University of Bridgeport (n=35), St. Vincent's College (n=20), and Sacred Heart University (n=12).



## Spring 2007 Cohort - Transferred to Out-of-State Institutions

Of the seventy-four (74) students who enrolled in colleges out-of-state, the majority of students (n=32) chose four-year independent institutions.
