To be considered registered, a student must complete a registration form, have it processed by the Registrar's Office, and then have their registration processed by the Bursar's Office. If a registration is not processed by both the Registrar's Office **and** the Bursar's Office, a student is not recognized by the College as registered for said course(s) and is therefore not automatically entitled to a grade and credit.

In the event a student remains in class to the end of the semester/ session with the approval of the faculty after the student has been administratively withdrawn from the College, the student will not automatically be reinstated and receive a grade and credit for said course(s).

Board of Trustee Policy does not allow for an Installment Payment Plan Option during the summer sessions.

TUITION REFUND POLICY

1. If you wish to withdraw from a course and receive a tuition and lab/studio fee refund, you must complete a drop form and return it to the Registrar's Office by 4:00 pm on Friday, May 29 for Sessions I and II, and by 4:00 pm on Thursday, July 2 for Session III. The college service fee is non-refundable.
2. No refunds are granted if withdrawal is after 4:00 pm on Friday, May 29 for Sessions I and II, and after 4:00 pm on Thursday, July 2 for Session III. Students will be taken off the class roster if formal withdrawal is begun within the first 3 to 7 calendar days after classes begin.
3. If a class is canceled, students will receive a full refund of tuition and fees.
4. Students who withdraw from a course after the start of the session and who wish to add an additional course in another session will be charged full tuition and fees for the added course. Students will not receive credit (refund) for a course dropped after the start of the session.
5. Please allow 2 to 3 weeks for receipt of your refund.

NOTE

If you were a Pell recipient for the Fall '07 and/or the Spring '08 semesters and haven't used up your full Pell award you may still be eligible for Summer '08 Pell grant monies. Check your eligibility at the Financial Aid Office, Room A102.

IMPORTANT NOTE

Students who receive partial financial aid are responsible for the balance of the tuition owed before classes begin. Failure to follow the above guidelines will result in cancellation of your registration.

Online Registration:

Student Self-Service is a part of the myCommNet internet service which allows you to view and print important information that is essential in planning your registration. This online alternative allows you to access both secured and public academic information via the internet. Students can access the system from any computer lab on campus or via a World Wide Web browser when off-campus.

Type of Information Available (login is required)
